- Industrial Training Institutes(ITIs)

KISHORI VIKASAM - III - GUIDELINES

INTRODUCTION:

Kishori Vikasam Scheme was launched in the year 2017-18 as a flagship programme for empowering the adolescent children across the state of Andhra Pradesh. The scheme works as a peer group motivational program wherein peer group trainers (PGTs) from colleges conduct trainings and awareness for school going adolescent children. In the year 2017-18, awareness and training sessions were conducted for 2,00,000 adolescent girls in 900 government residential institutions by 10130 spirited senior students pursuing graduation, post-graduation or professional courses across the state.

During Phase-II in the year 2018-19, the coverage of the programme was expanded to 14305 schools (Government, private and corporate schools) wherein 16,65,390 children of 8th, 9th and 10th classes were imparted awareness sessions on child sexual abuse, trafficking, child marriages, child protection rights and menstrual hygiene management with support of 68,845 college students and NSS Volunteers as peer group trainers.

KISHORI VIKASAM - Phase III

With success of two phases, Kishori Vikasam Phase-III is being initiated for 6th to 10th Class students in all Schools (private and government), Polytechnic Colleges, Junior Colleges and Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) across the State. The department of women development and child welfare is working as the nodal department in coordination with the departments of School Education, Collegiate Education, Higher Education and Technical Education for roll out of Phase-III of Kishori Vikasam, which is planned to be launched on 11th October, 2019 on **International Day of the Girl Child**. The scheme will be implemented in all 13 districts from 11th October 2019 to 31st January, 2020 with the following objectives:

Objectives

- To strengthen skills to recognize various form of abuse neglect, exploitation and violence and enhance the skills to act against it.
- To improve the understanding of various protective legislations and the standard operating procedure
- To develop capacity to respond effectively using existing protection mechanisms.
- > To promote ideas how to create a protective environment within their communities to form child friendly societies.
- To equip with knowledge on health and nutrition.

Target group

The target group for implementation of the scheme is :

- 6th to 10th Class students in all Schools (private, government, residential, tribal, gurukulams, KGBVs, ashram etc.)
- Junior Colleges
- Polytechnic Colleges
- Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs)

Themes:

The themes for this year's training and awareness programme is as follows:

- Child Marriage
- · Child Abuse
- Child Trafficking
- Anemia & Nutrition
- Menstrual Hygiene Management for Girls
- Women and Children Schemes and Activities
- Women Help Line -181 and One Stop Centres
- Role of Village & Ward Secretariats / Volunteers and their involvement
- · Mahila Mithra & Cyber Mithra

Modalities of the scheme

This scheme will be implemented by Department of Women Development and Child Welfare in collaboration with Department of School Education, College education, Higher Education and Technical Education.

The implementation of the scheme in a district involves the following steps:

- Constitution of a District Level Committee for planning, implementation and monitoring of the scheme.
- 2. Constitution of Project Resource Group at the project level in each district.
- 3.Assessment of the requirement of peer group trainers in the district.
- 4. Mobilizing the required number of interested and passionate students from degree and PG colleges to serve as Peer Group Trainers (PGTs).
- 5. Conducting Training of Trainers for PGTs.
- 6.Placement of Peer Group Trainers (PGTs) in schools for conducting awareness programme for Adolescent boys and girls of 6th to 10th Class students in all Schools, Polytechnic Colleges, Junior Colleges and Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs)
- Supervision and Monitoring and conduct of awareness programme by Peer Group Trainers (PGTs).
- 8. Follow up by the same PGTs teams after 6 months of awareness programme.

I. District level implementation committee

A District Level Committee needs to be constituted for implementation and monitoring of the scheme with the following members which will function under overall guidance of District Collector.

NOTE: It is recommended to include CEO Zilla Parishad along with DEO as one of the members of the District Implementation Committee, because it is important to co-ordinate with CEO, Zilla Parishad to carry out peer group education in Zilla Parishad High Schools in each district.

At planning stage, a meeting of the district level committee needs to be conducted for fixing of responsibilities to the line departments, assessing the requirement of teams of peer group trainers, preparation of plan for training of trainers, identification of resource personnel for ToTs etc.,

The District level committee to make arrangements for proper implementation of the scheme duly making necessary arrangements

- (i) For mobilizing and training of Peer Group Trainers (PGTs),
- (ii) For their transportation to conduct awareness programmes to boys and girls of 6th to 10th Class students in all Schools, Polytechnic Colleges, Junior Colleges and Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs)
- (iii) For providing necessary lodging and boarding facilities if required during the period of conducting the awareness programmes and subsequent 2 day follow up visit after 6 months.

The District level committee to arrange for supervision and monitoring of the training of Peer Group Trainers (PGTs), and all arrangements that are necessary for smooth conduct of awareness programmes duly involving the District/ Mandal level officers of

the Departments of Women Development and Child Welfare and School Education department.

The District Level Committee to plan for a meeting in all mandals to facilitate the PGTs with Certificates after completion of the Programme.

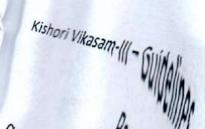
IB. District Resource Group: District Resource Groups (DRG) to be organized with the following members in each DRG:

- a) 3 Members of District Level Centre for Women under Mahila Shakti Kendra
- · Scheme i.e :
 - 1) Assistant Project Director, DW&CDA Women Welfare Officer
 - District Child Protection Officer District Coordinator-1
 - Extension Officer District Coordinator-2
- b) 1 CDPO with facilitation Skills
- c) 1 NGO with Women & Child related work experience
- d) Member from Women Empowerment Cell from nearby College
- e) Advocates DLSA Panel & Doctors (Gynaecologists)
- f) Any other member proposed by District Administration

II. Formation of Project Resource Group

A project resource group shall be constituted at the project level to train the PGTs. The CDPO's are responsible for the Identification of Multi- Disciplinary Project Resource Group (PRG) at the project level with the following members. Experts with different skill sets, professional and academic background to be selected i.e.,

- i. CDPO
- ii. NGO's working on child protection issues
- iii. Female doctor with specialization in Gynaecology
- iv. Member from Women Empowerment Cell in College
- v. Social activist (1-2)
- vi. Lawyer
- vii. Police officer



NOTE

- > In case of non- availability of female gynaecologists for resource group, it is recommended to take an active, well- articulated Health educator/ health supervisor with expertise in nutrition and health from the department of health and family welfare as resource person.
- > The PRG to implement Kishori Vikasam for Out of School Adolescents in collaboration with Nodal NGO and SERP at Project Level.

III. Eligibility criteria for the identification of PGTs

- The PGTs must be students identified from government/private degree colleges and PG colleges affiliated to a particular university and having passion for social work. Preference will be given to NSS volunteers, Phase-I and II Kishori Vikasam scheme PGTs.
- > Minimum 50% PGTs should be female.
- Should not have any adverse record.
- Must have participated in some form of Social work.
- Shall possess good communication skills.

Mobilizing the required number of interested NSS volunteers and IV. students from Degree and P.G colleges etc., to serve as peer group trainers in each project.

The CDPOs of each ICDS project is responsible for the collection of the list of degree and PG colleges (both government & Private) and high schools (both government and private) located in the project.

She has to co-ordinate with DEO, CEO, Zilla Parishad and registrar of the University for the Collection of list of colleges and high schools in her jurisdiction.

She has to ascertain information about the number of peer group trainer teams required based on the strength of 8th, 9th and 10th standards in high schools located in her project and also ensure that required number of PGTs could be

mobilized from each of the degree and PG colleges located in her purview. Ensure to have at least 50% female PGTs.

The APDO, EO and DCPU will act as liaison between the university management and high school management and guide the CDPOs in identification of PGTs, listing of colleges and high schools, mapping, mixing and matching of PGTs with schools and also monitor the work plans for PGT trainings as well as awareness programs in high schools.

V. Assessment of the requirement of peer group trainers in the district:

The requirement of teams of peer group trainers needs to be assessed based on the strength of 6th to 10th standards in each high school (both public and government) and Junior & Senior College Inter Students. The assessment of teams may be as follows:

No. of students in targeted School /Jr.College / ITI / Polytechnic Colleges		
If below 150	1 team (5 resource persons)	
151-300	2 teams	
301-450	3 teams	
451-600	4 teams	
601-750 & above	5 teams	

Note: In case if the school/Jr.College/ITI/Polytechnic strength is less than 50, it is recommended to gather the students from the nearby schools/colleges to one designated school/college and conduct the training by PGTs.

VI. Training of Peer Group Trainers

One day / Two day non- residential orientation training of Peer Group Trainers (based on the convenience) will be carried out at Project Level (3 or 4 Mandals based on geographical location) in their respective colleges of PGTs. Subject specific training will be given based on the interest of the peer group trainer. The

liaison officer should accompany her students for the project level orientation training.

- On Day 1, Orientation may be given to all the PGTs in a common hall with explanation about the program, their role and the tasks to be performed during the awareness programme for Adolescent boys and girls.
 - **NOTE:** Trainer's code of ethics will be informed by the project resource group to all the PGTs and explain about on how to establish and maintain standards of conduct for PGT trainers.
- Introduction to all the subject themes, in brief should be given. After the orientation, with the help of their liaison officer, the peer group trainers may be divided into 5 groups based on their interest in subject i.e., and training should be initiated by project resource group in detail for the particular subject theme.
- On Day 2 The training to PGTs should be continued for the theme specific topics which are not covered in day -1 orientation.

VII. Role of College Management

- The colleges should identify the students who are active, friendly, healthy, and
 positive and with good communication and leadership skills for this program
 as Peer Group Trainers, with the consent of the respective parents through a
 signed Consent Form.
- Parents' Meeting may be conducted at college level to acquaint the parents about Kishori Vikasam.
- The managements of institutions to provide venues for Orientation Training Program to PGTs and arrange logistics for transportation of PGTs, and Project Resource Group to conduct ToTs for PGTs.

NOTE:

> The college management with high number of students i.e. greater than 100 students identified as PGTs may provide their college as venue for PGT training for feasibility of the students as well the project resource group.

- For colleges with less than 50 students identified as PGTs, it is recommended to gather PGTs from nearby colleges that come under the same ICDS project to attain a minimum strength of 150 and conduct training to all the gathered PGTs at a designated venue either in one batch or in batches based on the strength of the PGTs.
 - Further, it is also suggested to utilize the PGTs of Phase 1 and Phase 2 of Kishori Vikasam scheme if there is shortage of PGTs.

VII. Placement of Peer Group Trainers for conducting awareness programme for Adolescent boys and girls of 6th to 10th Class students in all Schools, Polytechnic Colleges, Junior Colleges and Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs)

- The CDPO in co-ordination with DEO and PO SSA shall carry out the mapping of schools, matching and batching of PGTs.
- Necessary arrangements are to be made by the District Administration for (i) the transportation of the Peer Group trainers at the designated venues for conducting the 2 day training at high schools in collaboration with Managements of Colleges.

NOTE: It is the responsibility of the CDPO, Gram Panchayat, and school management to provide proper Lodging & Boarding facility (provision of mid-day meals) in case needed for the peer group trainers and the liaison officers.

The venue for the awareness programme must be school/ an educational institution with 5 class rooms of 50 students capacity so as to facilitate the conduct of training on 5 topics as mentioned below in the table and also for the sub group activities, role plays, games etc.,

NOTE: In case if the strength of 6th to 10th standards in a high school is < 50 students, it is recommended to group students of nearby High schools at a specific venue (specifically a school/ educational institute) to have a minimum strength of 100 -200 and carryout the training by the PGTs.

NOTE: For topics on child abuse separate sessions for boys and girls shall be conducted. With respect to menstrual hygiene and management, the session is limited to girls only.

The Peer Group Trainers to impart knowledge to boys and girls of 6th to 10th classes and Junior College at assigned school/ education institution with enthusiasm using Participatory Teaching Methodology.

NOTE: They have to upload the following details in an APP developed by the department of women development and child welfare.

- Number of trainings/ sessions conducted
- Coverage of the students

- > Pasting of information poster on child friendly wall at the high schools etc
- > Constitution of student resource group (5 boys and 5 girls) at the high school
- Constitution of nodal teacher team (3 teachers with at least one female teacher.
- Distribution of resource kit to the student resource group

Each PGT should also prepare a report on the training conducted during their placement period using the prescribed format duly mentioning any

- Special issues noticed during their interaction that deserves the (i) attention of higher officials.
- Special achievements, (ii)
- Their experiences etc., (iii)

Certificate of Participation:

- Each Peer Group Trainer will get a "CERTIFICATE OF PARTICIPATION" for Training of Trainers Programme and SERVICE CERTIFICATE from the concerned district authorities in any district functions headed by local Officials & non-officials.
- The work done will be considered as project work by the concerned Educational Institutions.

Experience Sharing Meeting at Project Level

After completion of the placement at the designated venues a meeting needs to be held at project level for getting feedback on the placement experiences, to share the problems and issues noticed at high school level.

ROLE OF DISTRICT COLLECTOR

 Overall responsibility lies with the District Collector to ensure proper planning, implementation and monitoring of the Scheme for Empowerment of AGs in the District.

- ➤ IEC Materials, BCC Videos and Radio Episodes from UNICEF to be provided to School Education Department to be included in Virtual Classrooms at regular intervals.
- Grama Samrakshana Karyadarshi/Ward Women and Weaker sections protection secretary in Gram/Ward Secretariats to be involved in Kishori Vikasam at School Level.
- All the necessary care and management steps are to be taken by the district administration to arrange logistics for transportation, food, stay and accommodation for the Resource Teams & Liaison Officers and certificate distribution to all PGTs & Officials involved in the programme.
- Route officers to be allotted for each team for facilitation for travel, logistic arrangements and for other required statutory permissions.
- Mandal level officers to be involved to coordinate and to ensure smooth conduct of the trainings as planned.

ROLE OF DISTRICT EDUCATIONAL OFFICER:

- > Assessment of the requirement of peer group trainers in the District.
- > Conducting a meeting with Principals of Colleges of Graduation and Post-Graduation of all streams.
- Identification of suitable dates for the training program of TOTs and awareness programme on PGTs without clashing with examinations and practical of the PGTs.
- > After a gap of 3 to 4 days project level orientation program should be given to the teams after which they should be sent to selected upper primary and high schools to train the students.

ROLE OF PROJECT OFFICER, SSA

- Mapping exercise to be carried out by the PO, SSA under the guidance of the DEO.
- The District/Mandal level officers to closely supervise and monitor the conduct of awareness programme by PGTs, follow up visit and facilitate smooth conduct of the programme.

ROLE OF UPPER PRIMARY AND HIGH SCHOOL OFFICIALS

- Officials at Upper primary and High schools in co-ordination with PD,ICDS and CDPOs have to make arrangements for Lodging & Boarding of the PGTs and liaison officers.
- > Schools have to arrange Class Rooms for conduct of sessions for 5 groups in the two day training programme & two day follow up visit.
- > Schools have to provide required material for the awareness programme and follow up visits i.e., Pens, Pencils, Display Board and Charts etc.,
- > Each School to appoint a Nodal Officer to oversee the implementation of Kishori Vikasam-III at School level.

ROLE OF COLLEGE MANAGEMENT

- College Management Members to get the consent from the parents of the PGTs through a signed consent form.
- > Parents' meeting may be conducted to acquaint parents about Kishori Vikasam.
- School/College Management to arrange logistics for transportation facilities for the Project Resource Group for the ToT.
- Ensure Code of Conduct for PGTs.
- To arrange the Liaison Officer for management of peer group trainer teams for their Safety and Security purpose.

ROLE OF DISTRICT MEDICAL AND HEALTH OFFICER

- > Arrange for a medical unit at the venues for the Project Level ToTs at villages when programmes are being conducted.
- Provide trainers to handle the topics on adolescence and Menstrual Hygiene.

ROLE OF PROJECT DIRECTOR, DW&CDA

- > Co-ordinate with Degree and PG College authorities to conduct meeting with principals to share the concept of KV and identification of PGTs from respective colleges.
- Co-ordinate with CDPOs to identify Professional Resource persons for Project Resource Group.

- Make all arrangements for the conduct of the Two-day Orientation training program with the support of District Administration.
- > The District/ Mandal level officers have to closely supervise and monitor the conduct of awareness programme by PGTs, follow up visits and facilitate smooth conduct of the programme.
