Guidelines for 4th Round Nava Nirmana Deeksha Programme from 2nd – 8th June, 2018

1. Introduction:

1.1 Consequent to the bifurcation of the State of Andhra Pradesh, Government is observing the appointed day i.e., 2nd June every year as "Nava Nirmana Deeksha (NND)". The Nava Nirmana Deeksha is the brain child of the Hon'ble Chief Minister to inspire people to dedicate themselves for rebuilding the State after the bifurcation. The Government holds several programmes all through the week inspiring people to rededicate themselves overcoming the crisis that was forced on them through State bifurcation. The Government have been observing 2nd June, 2015 as Nava Nirmana Deeksha Day. It is now proposed to conduct 4th round NND from 2nd – 8th June, 2018.

2. Objective:

- 2.1 The objective of the programme is to engage in a meaningful stakeholder consultation in preparation of GP/Ward level action plans on the basic needs of the village/ ward viz., drinking water, roads, drains etc., to achieve overall development of the village/ward with due consideration of bench mark values of the respective sectors by theme based discussion with the resource persons/ stake holders.
- 2.2 To achieve above objective the Government has devised a mission based strategy that essentially tracks development and welfare activities through seven missions, five grids and five campaigns.
- 2.3 The State have achieved Double Digit Growth with an integrated approach towards development and welfare on saturation basis of certain assurances at village and family level i.e. Kutumba Vikasam and Samaja Vikasam by providing basic facilities in each village during the last 4 years with untiring and relentless efforts.

3. Structure of the Programme:

- 3.1 The Government is proposed to observe 4th round Nava Nirmana Deeksha from 2nd June to 8th June 2018 in all GPs/ Wards. The program of NND will be initiated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister with Pledge followed

by discussions on issues related to State Re-organisation Act and Special Status on 2nd June' 2018 at 9 AM in Benz Circle, Vijayawada. All the citizens of the State make sure to take the pledge by reading the text of the pledge distributed in advance. At village level, Mandal level, District level the pledge will be taken followed by telecast of Hon'ble CM speech. The following are the themes identified for discussion on all 7 days of the programme.

3.2 The public speeches and debates in all GPs/wards will be conducted on every day from 2nd June to 8th June 2018 on specified themes.

3.3 During the day of the programme the GP/ Ward level teams will make necessary arrangements for conduct of the theme of the programme at the identified location.

- 3.4 At the Village/ Ward level, people will be attending from 2.00p.m to 5.00 p.m. and participate in the deliberation on the theme of the day.
- 3.5 The Mandal/ Municipal Level Teams will visit in all GPs/Wards to ensure to coordinate with the GP/Ward level teams for conducting of the theme of the programme in all days.
- 3.6 In addition, a **village walk** should be taken up daily during forenoon to inspect the infrastructure connected to the theme of the day, laying of foundation stones, inaugurations etc if any.
- 3.7 Asset Distribution – Scholarship of Labour department, Chandranna Bhima claims settlement, new ration cards, house sites, etc.

4. **GP/Ward Level Discussion on 7 Themes:**

- 4.1 The day wise discussions on respective assigned themes will take place daily during afternoon from 2.00 P.M to 5.00 P.M. at GP/Ward level after the telecast of the Hon'ble Chief Minister speech.
- 4.2 The discussion shall focus on last four years achievements made on the respective themes of the day's programme, major challenges, key issues, best practices, benchmarks and vision for short term, medium term, long term and strategies to achieve the targets.
- 4.3 The discussion shall be coordinated and convened by the Panchayat Secretary/ Bill collector and facilitated by the village/ Ward level functionaries connected to the theme. All village/ Ward level functionaries irrespective of the departments like VEO, VRO, Agricultural Officer, Veterinary Officer, Ward members, sanitary inspectors shall attend this activity daily in the respective GPs/ wards apart from the JB Committee members, ASHA workers, ANM, AWW, Sadhikar Mitras NRTs, GP Sarpanch and others.
- 4.4 Collectors should constitute a **Program Management Committee** for each GP/Ward for coordinating this activity at village level. Services of a Senior Teacher should also be taken for coordinating the program.
- 4.5 The departments concerned are responsible for providing content for the respective themes as indicated in the above table.
- 4.6 The Special Chief Secretary/ Principal Secretary/ Secretaries concerned shall take necessary action in preparing the content of the respective themes of the day's of the programme duly considering the

achievements made during last four years with bench mark values in the respective sectors.

- 4.7 The departments also shall take necessary steps to set the targets for the year 2018-19 for the respective sectors and communicate the information to the District Collectors well in advance for making fruitful discussions during the programme in all GPs/ Wards.
- 4.8 The department concerned will also present the profile of the village in a format prescribed by the same department. This village level format will need to be uploaded in the website being provided by the Department of Real Time Governance.
- 4.9 Hon'ble Chief Minister speech will be **live telecasted** daily on the related themes to all the GPs/ Wards in the state. It is therefore directed to establish a screen at the venue in each GP and to arrange for the direct telecast of the Hon'ble Chief Minister speech. The AP Fibernet Corporation will assist to establish the screen and the link for direct telecast.

5. Cultural programmes:

- 5.1 Cultural Programmes should be conducted related to each theme of the day after telecast of Hon'ble CM message/speech and discussion on the specified theme including theme based songs.
- 5.2 Department of Culture will conduct programmes like Kuchipudi dance, folk dance, songs, music, puppetry, poets meet, etc., in all GPs/ Wards during the programme by arranging cultural teams.
- 5.3 The District Collector shall take necessary measures for conducting the cultural programmes in the GP/Wards by appointing JC -II as in-charge for this activity.
- 5.4 The department of culture shall also coordinate with department of School Education to ensure participation of school children in the cultural activities conducted at GP/ Ward level. DPRO should coordinate the schedule of the day wise programme and logistics of the cultural teams.

6. GP/ Ward Level Competitions:

- 6.1 Competitions like debate/ elocutions/essay writings/ Painting shall be conducted daily during forenoon in each GP/Ward on the theme of the day. Best entries in each category should be compiled GP/Ward wise by

the Department of Culture. The winners of the competitions shall be rewarded during the afternoon session of the same day.

- 6.2 It is also decided that the Department of Youth Advancement and Sports will organise traditional/ rural games at GP/ Ward level.
- 6.3 The personalities who have shown exemplary works on the themes of the programme as scheduled shall be felicitated in the afternoon session of the programme.

7. Exhibition:

- 7.1 An exhibition is to be organised daily related to the theme of the day.
- 7.2 The departments concerned for the theme of the day shall arrange for dissemination of required material for the Exhibition.

8. Officers Responsible at Various Levels:

- 8.1 The District Collector is responsible for the programme at District level supported by District Panchayat Officer and District Level Committee constituted for the coordination of the NND programme.
- 8.2 Mandal Development officers are responsible for the respective Mandal's and the Municipal Commissioner at the Municipality level. These officers shall be responsible in all respects for organizing and conducting the programme successfully.
- 8.3 The Gram Panchayat/Mandal level Committee coordinates the programme at the Panchayat/Mandal level in the rural areas.
- 8.4 The Municipal ward/division Committee will coordinate the programme at the Municipal level in the urban areas.
- 8.5 The District Collector is to ensure to invite the academicians, eminent personalities/ subject experts of the day of the themes concerned to participate in the above programmes on every day of Nava Nirmana Deeksha Programme.
- 8.6 The Commissioner, I&PR shall be responsible for supply of publicity material like posters, hand bills, audio CDs, brochures etc., to all the districts.
- 8.7 The M.D. AP Fibre Net is responsible to link the L.E.D. screens in all GPs/ Wards for direct telecast of Hon'ble Chief Minister.
- 8.8 The Special Chief Secretary, Youth Advancement & Sports shall ensure to coordinate the sports activities in all GPs/Wards.


- 8.9 The Secretary, Tourism & Culture shall ensure to coordinate the cultural programmes in all GPs/Wards.
9. **Budgetary support:** An amount of Rs.1.00 Crore per district is provided for conduct of the programme.
10. **Data Collection and Transmission:** The RTG will develop an input format for online entry at GP/ Ward level to capture the information on the related themes of the day wise programme.
11. **General Instructions:**
- 11.1 The members of the JB Committees, Sadhikara Mitras, SHGs, Asha workers, at Mandal/Municipality levels and at GP/Ward level should actively participate during the Nava Nirmana Deeksha programme. All village functionaries should participate in every village / Ward during the Nava Nirmana Deeksha programme.
 - 11.2 All the District Collectors shall make arrangements for providing the information daily by the end of the day on conduct of the programme in the website developed for the purpose.
 - 11.3 Control rooms must be opened in offices of the District Collectors for providing any clarifications sought from the GPs/ wards during the programme period. The contact person's name and contact numbers should be publicized.
 - 11.4 The meeting place should be comfortable and sufficient to accommodate.
 - 11.5 The list of the day's invitees must be carefully prepared so as to involve all relevant stake holders, officials, non-officials, eminent personalities, beneficiaries, people who have participated in Samaikyandhra agitation etc.
 - 11.6 To ensure to invite the academicians, eminent personalities/ subject experts to participate in the above programmes on every day of Nava Nirmana Deeksha.
 - 11.7 It must be ensured that GP/ Ward level data must be prepared on the relevant subject of the day, the date must reflect the base line in 2014, the achievements in the last 4 years and goals for future.
 - 11.8 To direct the DPRO and the Deputy Executive Information Engineer of I&PR to coordinate with the Commissioner, I&PR, Andhra Pradesh to get the publicity material for the subjects proposed for debate and

- discussions, photo exhibitions and LED displays, television coverage of the events, playing Audio / Video songs on Government Schemes etc.
- 11.9 To ensure to form Media Coordination Committees for effective communication with press / T.V.
 - 11.10 To instruct all District Officers to prepare brief note / talking points concerning their subjects as per the above subjects and to ensure effective participation in the programme being organized GP/ Ward level.
 - 11.11 The daily Progress shall be uploaded into the online web portal created for the purpose by the RTG. The CPOs concerned should be made responsible for this. The Information shall be uploaded by 5pm.
 - 11.12 To ensure to obtain feedback from all the District Officers about the programmes conducted on each day of the programme.
 - 11.13 The District Collector shall ensure to conduct cultural programmes at the venue of the programme on every day after the public speeches and debates are over on the specified themes.
 - 11.14 The District Collector must prepare a district specific and GP/ Ward specific Mahasankalpam pledge for taking the same on 8th June at 5.00 PM.
 - 11.15 The District Incharge-Minister will also participate in the above programmes and he/she will coordinate with District MLAs/MLCs (Constituency wise) and district officials.
 - 11.16 On 8th June, 2018 the District Collectors shall have to organize 'Maha Sankalpam Programme' at 5 pm at all GP/ Ward by involving mass gathering, public representatives and all stake holders.
 - 11.17 The Social media can be used for pre-programme publicity and for coverage of the daily programme. Video recording of the important activities of the programme must be taken up.

The Government vide reference cited have issued Guidelines for conduct of 4th round Nava Nirmana Deeksha from 2nd -8th June, 2018. The District Collectors shall ensure to conduct the programme for all the 7 days. The following are the additional guidelines issued now for successful conduct of 4th round Nava Nirmana Deeksha.

Additional Guidelines on 4th Round Nava Nirmana Deeksha

- The District Collector shall ensure to appoint Mandal/ Municipal level officers as Nodal Officers to all GPs/ Wards for smooth conduct of NND programme. If required the Nodal Officers for GP can also be appointed officers from the District Offices. This instruction can be replaced with para no.3.5 of the guidelines vide reference cited above.
The Nodal Officer shall be made responsible for preparation of village vision document. A plan of action of the village shall be prepared taking account of all resources, with an aim to reach pre identified bench mark values in various sectors like economic, education and social. The template for preparation of village/ ward vision document is being communicated separately.
- The District Collector shall ensure to appoint district level officers as supervisory officers to the Mandal/Municipality and they will be responsible for coordination and smooth conduct of the programme by visiting all the GPs/Wards in the Mandal.
- The District Collector shall ensure that the Nodal Officers of GP/Ward conduct the programme on all the seven (7) days as per the themes of the programme.


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- The District Collector shall ensure that the erection of TV/Screen in all GPs/ Wards for the live telecast of Hon'ble CM's speech in coordination with MD Fibre Net and the Commissioner I&PR.
- The Principal Secretaries/ Secretaries concerned with respect to theme of the day shall ensure to send content paper and talking points of the themes, other material like display material for exhibition etc... to all the District Collectors for utilizing same in the discussions at GPs/Wards.
- The C.E.O. RTG, shall ensure to send the Praja Saadhikara Survey Data to the Districts, GP / Ward wise for verification by the GP/Ward level teams.
- The District Collector shall ensure the Nodal Officers of GP/Ward are responsible to collect the daily information with the help of Panchayat Secretary/ Ward level officers on the theme concerned and make online entry provided by the RTG.
- The day wise theme wise list of village level functionaries to be participated in discussions and debates on every day is **annexed** as Annexure-I.
- The activities to be taken up by the GP/Ward level teams in forenoon session and the indicative agenda for the theme wise discussion in afternoon session is **annexed** as annexure-II & III for taking necessary action.




